SEXUAL HARASSMENT AND OTHER PROHIBITED SEXUAL CONDUCT

The University is committed to creating and maintaining a campus environment in which all individuals are treated with respect and dignity and are free to participate in a lively exchange of ideas. Furthermore, the University is committed to fostering an environment in which all members of our campus community are safe, secure, and free from sexual misconduct of any form, including, but not limited to, sexual harassment, sexual assault, dating violence, domestic violence, and stalking. The University expects all interpersonal relationships and interactions – especially those of an intimate nature – to be grounded upon mutual respect, open communication, and clear consent. Each student has the right to learn and each employee has the right to work in an environment free of sexual harassment and other prohibited sexual conduct.

The purpose of this policy is also to ensure that no member of the University community will be retaliated against for refusing or objecting to sexual harassment or other prohibited sexual conduct, or making an allegation of sexual harassment or other prohibited sexual conduct.

HAZING

The University, including the Office of Student Affairs, is committed to fostering a campus environment that is conducive to academic inquiry, a productive campus life, and thoughtful study and discourse. The student conduct program within the Office of Student Rights and Responsibilities is committed to an educational and developmental process that balances the interests of individual students with the interests of the University community.

Acts of hazing are considered irresponsible, intolerable, and inconsistent with the University's mission. Student organizations and/or individual members found to have engaged in hazing shall be in violation of this policy and may be in violation of state law (La. R.S. 14:40.8).

STUDENT ALCOHOL AND DRUG POLICY

The University prohibits the unlawful use (or as restricted by University policy), possession, manufacture, and distribution of illegal drugs and alcohol by its students on its property or as part of any of University-sponsored activity.

This policy provides a vehicle for the University to promote a healthy environment for Students and discourage the illegal use of alcohol and illegal drugs. Through this policy, the University aims to offer education, short-term treatment, and/or referrals to those who may be affected. This policy describes the University's response to the substance abuse problem from two broad perspectives: the educational perspective and the prevention perspective.
