Whether through 3MT®, A2i<sup>TM</sup>, or some other pursuit, I hope that you'll join your fellow researchers, writers, entrepreneurs, artists, educators, and others as we press forward to address the gaps through meaningful connection, solutions, and impact.

By offering a unique blend of academic rigor and practical industry experience, A2i empowers students to translate their research into realworld solutions that address pressing global challenges, says NSF.

### Accelerate to Industry™

FOUNDED BY THE NC STATE UNIVERSITY GRADUATE SCHOOL

The Accelerate to Industry (A2i™) program is designed to increase awareness among graduate and postdoctoral researchers about the growing range of industry career opportunities, as well as the business and professional skills sought by today's hiring executives.

Leveraging the unique position of the Graduate School at NC State University, Dr. Peter Harries and his team developed, administered, and advanced this innovative program beginning in 2016 and expanded through an NSF Innovations in Graduate Education (IGE) grant in 2019. The bold approach to enhancing industry workforce readiness now guides 30+ academic partners in grad schools across the nation. Last week, UL Lafayette became an official academic partner institution and, in addition to now being able to offer our graduate students access to external programming and initiatives, will begin its A2i<sup>™</sup> journey in the coming months.

In a recent spotlight, the NSF used words like "groundbreaking" and "pioneering" to describe A2i™. The model includes not only the more

traditional professional development programming that we know well but also more innovative approaches to mentorship and networking, industry immersion, and internships and fellowships. The results at NC State have been impressive. "The A2i program has been instrumental in shaping program participants' careers," says Harries of A2i program participants in the NSF piece. "The soft and research skills and industry immersion

knowledge gained through A2i open doors for program graduates to work in industry and make significant contributions in their fields."

The Doctoral Research and Travel Grant Program, funded by the Office of Research and administered

by the Graduate School, supports UL Lafayette doctoral students as they conduct and disseminate research that supports degree completion. These grants help cover expenses related to defined research projects and creative works linked to your dissertation or synthesis project.

Pre-candidate doctoral students are eligible for annual awards of up to \$1500.

ABD doctoral candidates are eligible for annual awards of up to \$2500.
