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## WHAT ARE THE PRIMARY CHALLENGES & OPPORTUNITIES FOR LGBTQ+ COLLEGE STUDENTS IN FORMING SOCIAL CONNECTIONS & FINDING A SENSE OF COMMUNITY ON CAMPUS?

### HOUSING ISSUES:

- Many campuses do not offer gender-neutral or LGBTQ+ friendly housing options, leaving students with limited choices.

### DISCRIMINATION:

### INTERSECTIONALITY:

### LEGAL & POLICY ISSUES:
