Writing Tips & Tools

The writing challenges you face during your time in graduate school might seem overwhelming, but with determination and support, you can—and will —overcome them. As you begin developing your repertoire of writing strategies, practice drafting writing without inhibition. Drafting freely reduces anxieties associated with writing, allows you to take stock of what you already know, and helps you prioritize the writing process over the final product. At some point, though, you will need to develop a plan.

Mike Rose, author of <u>Rigid Rules, Inflexible Plans, and the Stifling of Language</u>, argues that writer's block stems from rigid rules, which he describes as fixed, inflexible ideas about writing that prevent progress. Instead, he suggests, writers should employ flexible and strategic plans.

Here's an example. Let's say you develop an outline with the following rule in mind: "For my work to be successful, my finished product must match my original outline." At best, this rule might somewhat aid your progress. At worst, it will actively inhibit your ability to write. Consider instead: "I will use an outline to organize my thoughts, and I can adjust the outline if it makes sense to do so." In contrast to a rule, this plan provides a course of action that facilitates improvement and growth.

As you work on your next project, examine your toolbox of writing resources—free writes, outlines, reverse outlines, techniques for argumentation, methods for incorporating sources, etc. Ask yourself what rules you've applied to these techniques in the past. Accelerate to IndustryTM FOUNDED BY THE NC STATE UNIVERSITY GRADUATE SCHOOL Last month's A2i event, hosted by the Graduate School at UL Lafayette, featured Georges Antoun, Chief Commercial Officer at First Solar, who shared valuable insights on initiative in career growth.

Antoun gave an overview of First Solar's progress, noting that all manufacturing for U.S. plants is done in the U.S. while international plants serve their respective regions. He emphasized that initiative is essential at every stage of your career—even in graduate programs. Internships, he said, are a great way to enter the workforce, sharing that First Solar hires many interns—including a graduate assistant from our school who landed a full-time job after an internship!

Antoun also offered practical advice for job seekers, stressing the importance of a concise, onepage resume. (HR won't read a long one.) He recommended doing your research, being professional, and always following up. During interviews, be prepared to show your can-do attitude, willingness to learn, and accountability. Lastly, never get too comfortable in a job there's always room to grow. His mantra: under-promise, over-deliver.
