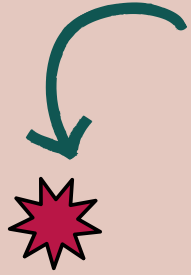

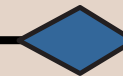


WHAT IS UNIV 100?
