Parent PLUS Loan

The PLUS loan is a loan that parents request for their students' educational expenses. The PLUS application becomes available in May 2025 for the 2025-2026 award year.

Parents should apply online at studentaid.gov/plus-app. If approved, the parent is eligible for a loan up to the student's Cost of Attendance minus Aid/Other Resources. If denied, the student is eligible for an additional unsubsidized loan up to \$4,000 (0-59 earned credit hours) or \$5,000 (60 or more earned credit hours).
