
- The Spring Only 2026 application opens on December 1, 2025.

SUITE STYLE RESIDENCE HALL

Baker, Bonin, Coronna, and Huger Halls


- All come furnished with a Twin XL bed frame and mattress, a desk with a chair, an armoire, and a dresser per student.
- All utilities are included: electricity, water, laundry, and internet.
- Double and select single rooms available:
 - Double suites: two people per bedroom with 2 shared in-suite bathrooms (2 students share each bathroom)
 - Single suites: one person per bedroom with a shared in-suite bathroom (2 students share the bathroom)
- All common areas come with 1 microwave and 1 mini-fridge for the suite to share, a vanity area, and a counter for storage.
- Laundry facilities are on the first floor.



JUNIOR SUITE STYLE RESIDENCE HALL

Agnes Edwards Hall


- All come furnished with a Twin XL bed frame and mattress, a desk with a chair, an armoire, and a dresser per student.
- All utilities are included: electricity, water, laundry, and internet.
- Double and select single rooms available:
 - Double suites: two people per bedroom with 1 shared jack and jill bathroom between the bedrooms (4 students share the bathroom)
 - Single suites: one person per bedroom with 1 shared jack and jill bathroom between the bedrooms (2 students share the bathroom)
- Laundry facilities are in the basement.

Harris Hall


- All come furnished with a Twin XL bed frame and mattress, a desk with a chair, an armoire, and a dresser per student.
- All utilities are included: electricity, water, laundry, and internet.
- Double and select single rooms available:
 - Double suites: two people per bedroom with a shared community bathroom (~20 students share the bathroom per wing)
 - Single suites: one person per bedroom with a shared community bathroom (~20 students share the bathroom per wing)
- Laundry facilities are on the first floor.



LEGACY PARK APARTMENTS

24+ credit hours and lived on campus for at least one year


- Bedrooms come furnished with a Twin XL bed frame and mattress, a desk with a chair, and a dresser per student.
- The common area comes furnished with a couch, chair, TV stand, barstools, and a table with chairs
- The kitchen comes furnished with a refrigerator, stove/oven, and microwave
- In-unit laundry.
- All utilities are included: electricity, water, laundry, and internet.
- 1-, 2-, and 3-bedroom apartments available:
 - 1-bedroom private: 1 student assigned to the 1-bedroom, 1-bathroom private apartment
 - 1-bedroom shared: 2 students share the 1-bedroom, 1-bathroom apartment
 - 2-bedroom: 2 students assigned to a 2-bedroom, 2-bathroom apartment
 - 3-bedroom: 3 students assigned to a 3-bedroom, 3-bathroom apartment



THE HERITAGE APARTMENTS

60+ credit hours and 20 years old

- Bedrooms come furnished with a Full bed frame and mattress, a desk with a chair, a closet, and a dresser per student.
- The common area comes furnished with a couch, chair, coffee table, TV stand, and barstools.
- The kitchen comes furnished with a refrigerator, stove/oven, dishwasher, and microwave
- In-unit laundry.
- All utilities are included: electricity, water, laundry, and internet.
- 2-, 3-, 4-bedroom apartments available:
 - 2-bedroom: 2 students assigned to a 2-bedroom, 2-bathroom apartment
 - 3-bedroom: 3 students assigned to a 3-bedroom, 3-bathroom apartment
 - 4-bedroom: 4 students assigned to a 4-bedroom, 4-bathroom apartment



 could be deemed the fault of the residents.







Every resident is given a key at check-in, and they are responsible for maintaining possession of the key until check-out.


- There is a fee for a staff member to unlock the door (each door, each time)
 - \$25 fee from 8:00 a.m. 10:00 p.m.
 - \$50 fee from 10:00 p.m. 8:00 a.m.
- The lost key fee is \$200.00. This covers replacing the key and all locks associated with the lost key. Please notify your Property Manager or RA immediately if you lose your key.

HIGHLY RECOMMEND FOR ALL RESIDENTS LIVING ON CAMPUS


- Most people only think about renters' insurance after the fact, but we highly recommend purchasing it before you move onto campus.

- Talk about how you will decorate the room and the common space, and what each will bring






WHEN YOU GET TO CAMPUS:
