Louisiana Educate Program Overview

Overview

The Louisiana Educate Program will accept a cohort of students who are eligible for the maximum Federal Pell Grant and the Louisiana TOPS program. Students accepted into this program will receive additional support and grants that are designed to make college truly affordable and provide the support and services for each student to be successful.

Program Components

Offices and Systems

- A personal admissions officer to answer questions and provide assistance with the admissions process.
- A personal financial aid counselor to provide assistance with the financial aid application & payment processes.
- A personal scholarship counselor to provide assistance to the students who qualify for UL Lafayette academic scholarships.
- A designated freshman orientation at which all new Louisiana Educate Program participants attend. At orientation there will be a special breakout session for Louisiana Educate Program students at which students will meet the UL Lafayette Support team and learn more about the program.

Academic

- A personal academic success coach to provide all academic consultations.
- During your undergraduate experience you will be advised by your assigned college academic advisor.
- Required study hall with academic tutoring for a designated number of hours each week.

Engagement and Social Belonging

- Live on campus in the residence hall during your first year where Louisiana Educate participants will live together, based on gender, and be part of a Community Cohort.
- You will also live on campus during your second year and subsequent years but you get to choose your roommate.
- A campus work-study job for 9-12 hours each week.
- A co-curricular component designed to get the students involved and engaged on campus.

Career Readiness

- Students will schedule the LEP Seminar each semester
- Attend Career Readiness and Preparation Programs
- LEP program will provide support in attaining at least (1) internship

Financial Details

Participating students will receive three types of additional grant aid on top of their basic award package

- 1) Supplemental grant: \$1,500 per semester for up to eight semesters
- 2) Private Gap Scholarship: As outlined in the chart below
- 3) Work Study: \$1,300 per semester for 9-12 hours of work per week.
