

The University's first president? He was one of the nation's youngest, a 27-yearold named Edwin Stephens. He was named the first president of Southwestern Louisiana Industrial Institute SLII (now the University of Louisiana at Lafayette or UL/ULL) on Jan. 23, 1900. SLI, which was created by the Louisiana Legislature in 1898, had no campus, no faculty, and no students. So, he began to build it from the ground up.

In January 1901, Stephens planted oak seedlings on campus. Many flourished, a few remain — at the intersection of University Avenue and Johnston Street and are known as the Century Oaks. History has nevertheless proven Stephens had the right vision for the fledgling agricultural college.




After breakfast, we headed to the library and did some classwork.
